These have included our 'Oberon in the 1930's' streetscape which is now restored and occupying pride of place in the entrance extension. What a difference the restoration has made! We hope to have a protective glass fence around this exhibit in the future.

The process of locating, cleaning, recording and displaying many hundreds of items continues both inside and outside the pavilion.
